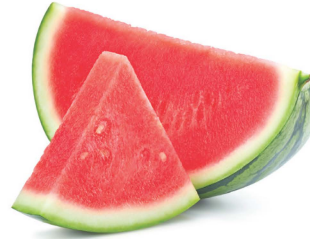


Fun Facts about the month of July

THE MONTH OF JULY IN HISTORY

- July 1, 1862: President Abraham Lincoln signed the first income tax bill
- July 1, 1863: The Battle of Gettysburg began during the American Civil War
- July 2, 1788: Congress announced the ratification of the U.S. Constitution
- July 2, 1964: President Lyndon B. Johnson signed the Civil Rights Act of 1964
- July 4, 1776: The Declaration of Independence was approved by the Continental Congress
- July 7, 1898: President William McKinley signed a resolution annexing Hawaii. In 1900 Congress made Hawaii an incorporated territory of the U.S. which it remained until it became a state in 1959
- July 16, 1945: The experimental atomic bomb "Fat Boy" was set off at 5:30am in the New Mexico desert
- July 20, 1969: Astronaut Neil Armstrong took his first step onto the moon as a global audience watched along on TV
- July 31, 1790: The U.S. Patent Office opened
